From Nate's Pen: We Believe: In the Holy Spirit

The Spirit of God is present and active in the opening verses of the Bible: **Genesis 1:1-2**: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. ² The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And **the Spirit of God** was hovering over the face of the waters." This lets us know that the Spirit of God has been actively involved in creation from the very beginning.



This coming Sunday, I will continue my sermon series about foundational Christian doctrine by preaching about the doctrine of the Holy Spirit. As with the biblical teaching about Jesus, there are two central concerns in the classic teaching about the Spirit: 1) His identity and 2) His work. We will explore both these topics on Sunday through two biblical texts: Joel 2:28-32 and Acts 2:14-41. I invite you to read and pray through these passages this week in preparation for Sunday's message.

When it comes to **knowing**, **loving**, and **living** the truth, the Holy Spirit's work in our lives is key for all three.

- He leads us into truth: John 16:13: "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for
 he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the
 things that are to come."
- He pours God's love into our hearts: **Romans 5:5**: "... and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us."
- He empowers us to walk according to God's will: **Galatians 5:16, 25**: "But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh... If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit."
